Circuit Courts: Drug, HOPE, MH Drug Court: Probation or dismissal; pre-/post-plea; felonies; 30 participants; 4 phases; contracts with Samaritan House for housing

HOPE Court: felonies; facing prison sentence- deferral; post-plea; 15 participants (20 soon); victim must be involved

Mental Health Court (no funding): probation or dismissal; pre-plea; capacity for 10; 1 year deferred sentences; 5 focuses (10 weeks each); mostly non-violent

DV Court: some individuals with MI; plead guilty; about 100 participants

Co-occurring disorders program: screens for best fit (Drug or MH Court)

Programming: volunteer Seeking Safety therapists (1M/1F); trauma; yoga (F); art as therapy; gambling groups; Celebrate Recovery; parenting; AA/NA; GED prep/certifications; Breaking Barriers

1 officer assigned to treatment courts, participates in release planning

Referrals to co-occurring (medication info would follow); referral to Celebrate Recovery if has a discharge date: 30-45 days of medication; Medicaid reactivation paperwork at 30 days prior to discharge (in-reach); face sheet w/ID # and remaining debit cards funds; VJO can assist veterans w/IDs, etc.

CHANCE grant: tri-country availability, reentry assistance, birth certificate/ID, rental assistance

ACT Peer Mentor/Case Manager do in-reach

St. Stephens Episcopal Church

12 overnight staff, no access from 11p-7am

Parole & Probation

11 Certified Parole Officers, all w/MHFA training and some CIT; caseloads of about 60; each handles jail and prison individuals (all felons except DV misdemeanors)

Community Justice- peer support- 4 beds

Data sharing

Specialized caseloads: 2 sex offenders, DV, female, MH Officer, Drug and HOPE Court

TAPS reentry staff person

Many referrals to co-occurring program for screening

New posting for Recovery Mentor- some time to Corrections
